



Sidewalk Garden Requirements

6' Pedestrian Path of Travel that is flat and straight, corner to corner

 4' ADA walkways from curb to sidewalk

18" Courtesy Strip along curb with parallel parking and 4' with perpendicular parking

4" – 15" high raised garden edging perpendicular to the curb




