

FAST FACTS ABOUT F&ES

- Founded in 1901, F&ES is one of Yale University's 13 graduate and professional schools. It is the oldest professional forestry school in the nation.
- F&ES offers four 2-year degree programs Master of Environmental Management (MEM),
 Master of Environmental Science (MESc), Master of Forestry (MF), and
 Master of Forest Science (MFS). F&ES also offers two 10-month programs (MEM
 and MF) for mid-career professionals with at least 7 years of experience.
- Areas of study include: Ecology, Ecosystems and Biodiversity; Social Ecology of Conservation and Development; Forestry, Forest Science and Forest Management; Global Change Science and Policy; Environmental Health, Industrial Environmental Management; Politics, Economics and the Law; Urban Ecology and Environmental Design; Water Science, Policy and Management; and more.
- Joint degree programs are available with Yale Schools of Management; Law; Divinity; Architecture; Public Health; International Development Economics; and International Relations. Joint degree programs are also available with Vermont Law School and Pace Law School, and a joint program is offered in Management with the Universidad de los Andes in Bogota, Colombia.
- For the 2012-2013 academic year, tuition was \$33,700 with an additional \$16,800 estimated for books, health insurance and living expenses.
- In 2012, F&ES had approximately \$3.8 million in scholarships available to award to master's students. Scholarships are awarded based on demonstrated financial need and academic merit, and range in award availability and size.
