April 8 Understanding Your Soils - Get a soil map, learn the basics of soil texture, how to water differently for different soils and how to prepare your soils for planting trees, shrubs or drought tolerant grasses. Taylor Lewis, Nursery Manager for the UC Davis Arboretum and Public Gardens, has a wealth of practical experience with different soils and can answer your questions.

April 15 - Right Plant - Right Place. Would you like to use less water on your yard or understand how to group your plants according to water or sun needs? Join Bernadette Balics of Ecological Landscape Design and the Yolo County Master Gardeners to hear from the experts and to see many of the trees and shrubs that are adapted to our region.



April 22 - Yard Irrigation How-To. Are you unsure about how to set, operate and maintain your sprinkler timer? Would you like to convert your sprinklers to drip? Join Greg Link from the Yolo County Master Gardeners and the City of West Sacramento Staff for information on sprinkler system management and conversion.

April 29 - Converting your lawn. Lawns are the thirstiest part of our home landscapes. Taylor Lewis of the UC Davis Arboretum will talk about how to reduce water waste while irrigating but still save the trees, or how to kill your lawn in a benign fashion and convert it to native or drought tolerant trees and shrubs.
