CITIZEN'S EFFORTS & TREE PRESERVATION IN FRESNO

Last July a front page article was written in the Fresno Bee about removing the camphor grove at Eaton Plaza. This article lead to a series of meetings to explore how to retain the larger, healthy trees in the grove. Clearly, this situation presented urban forest issues of regional significance. Eight members of the San Joaquin Valley Urban Forest Council met at the site, attended a city briefing, and advocated for retaining the mature trees. They then went to work to develop recommendations for the City of Fresno. Their report was well-received by the city staff and they were informed that a portion of the grove will be retained ... a happy ending!" Click here for
