She provided oversight for launching a countywide tree-mapping website that calculates the ecosystem benefits of urban trees - www.sandiegotreemap.org. Robin currently serves on the City of La Mesa Environmental/Sustainability Commission, the City of San Diego's Community Forest Advisory Board, and the Executive Committee for the San Diego Regional Urban Forests Council. She is also a certified utility forester, tree risk assessor, and an active member of the California Rare Fruit Growers organization. Robin lives in La Mesa where she helps tend a large backyard orchard, and believes home gardens should have components to mitigate climate change, provide edibles, attract birds and butterflies, and be water-efficient. In 2012, she received the Durrell Maughn Founder's Award as, "As an individual who had done the most to advance urban forestry education in the State of California"
